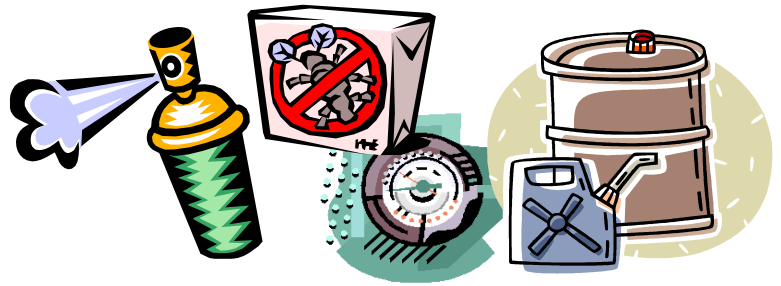

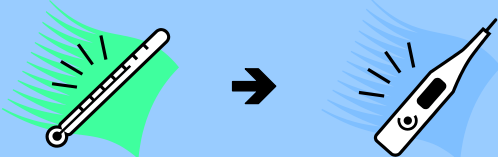

coordinator. Subsidized
quantities may be limited by
the town. *Proof of
residency is required.*

☠ Visitors **without an
authorization form** may
pay a fee of \$43 per 15
gallon containers or 30 lbs.
of material.

Accepted at all events:

From the workbench:

oil based paint and stains *
hobby/artist supplies
photography chemicals
fiberglass resins
adhesives

From the garage:

flammable liquids and aerosols
gasoline, motor oil mixtures
automotive fluids
tire and carburetor cleaners, degreasers
marine and auto paints

From the shed:

pesticides, herbicides, fungicides
fertilizers containing pesticides
pool chemicals
cesspool cleaners
wood preservatives



From the house:

Mercury, including thermometers
and thermostats *
drain cleaners
moth balls and crystals
hazardous cleaners and polishes
poisons
acids and bases

Accepted at some events:

Electronics *
Fluorescent tubes, compact fluorescents *
NiCd (rechargeable) and button batteries *
asbestos (friable): **CALL AHEAD**

Materials not accepted include:

industrial waste
radioactive materials (*smoke detectors
may be disposed in trash*)
pathological and medical waste
pressurized gas cylinders *
lead acid (automotive) batteries *
explosives

**Latex paint and driveway
sealer are *not hazardous*,
just messy. *Remove lid, air
dry or absorb with cat litter
or paint hardener, and
dispose with trash.*
Usable paint may also be
donated, call 781-545-1272**



* These materials are collected regularly by many towns.

Bring chemicals in original or labeled containers.

Improper disposal of these materials can *react, explode, create toxic fumes, contaminate* soil and groundwater and *endanger* the health and safety of people and animals.

Mercury, a heavy silver liquid, poisons the nervous system, liver and kidneys. ***Pregnant women and young children*** are most vulnerable.
